

## FIRST CIRCULAR CONCEPT NOTE

Rock Art is one of the most abundant forms of archaeological evidence which depicts the earliest expression of humankind. This prehistoric art represents the fundamental beliefs and views of the ancient people, depicting the gradual evolution of human cognition and understanding of their surrounding events and daily life observations which can be seen by their depictions ranging from the simplest of flora and fauna to the complex patterns and various themes relating to hunting scenes and many more.

Rock art which has been a universal phenomenon throughout time covers every continent and almost every country. India is among one of the largest rock art producing nations worldwide, the other major concentration regions, being found in Australia, Europe, Africa, and Russia. In many places of the world today, rock art research is a well-established field of study.

In the context of Indian Rock Art Studies, the first evidence of rock art in the form of petroglyphs (cupules) was discovered at Almora in 1856 by Henwood. But this work didn't get the attention of other scholars. Later, in 1867 the discovery of rock art paintings near Sohagi Ghat, in the present Mirzapur District of Uttar Pradeshby A.C.L. Carlleylemarked the beginning of the proper study of rock art in India. The discovery of rock paintings near Sohagi Ghat will go down in Indian rock art history as a watershed moment.

Today after 160+ years of first rock art discovery, these rock art in the form of pictographs, petroglyphs and geoglyphs can be found throughout different parts of India, with the Central India so far known for the maximum concentration of painted rock shelters, the regions of Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh, Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh are mostly known for rock art on stone boulders and the region of Konkan is known for the geoglyphs carved on the horizontal surface.

The rock art is found in almost all Indian states, leaving few such as Haryana and West Bengal, etc from which no reporting of these art forms have yet come to light. Each of these regions with rock art have their unique identity for which they are famous among the national and international community of rock art researchers and also among the tourists. Thus, to bring in light among the current researchers, students and heritage enthusiasts, we bring forth this lecture series, which will highlight the uniqueness of rock art found in the different parts of India showcasing the history of research, its identification and ongoing studies.

#### **Objectives& Expected Outcomes:**

#### • Showcase Statewide Uniqueness of Rock ArtIn India:

Highlight the uniqueness of the rock art found in different regions and states of India.

#### Awareness:

Awareness about the history of Rock art research in different parts of India among the young generation and upcoming researchers.

#### • Promoting Rock Art Heritage Tourism:

Through this Rock art lecture series, awareness and promotion of the rock art sites of different states will help in promoting rock art site heritage tourism.

#### • Foster Collaboration & Innovation:

This lecture series will encourage the young students and researchers to collaborate with rock art experts from different parts of India. We also aim to foster new innovative idea regarding the study of Indian Rock Art as an outcome of this lecture series.

#### • Book Publication:

The organisers plan to publish a book of compiled research papers after the completion of the online lecture series, it will help in having a updated data regarding the rock art research and its uniqueness in India.

The organisers aim to have an interactive session throughout this Rock art lecture series, where the young students and researchers can discuss about their doubts and queries regarding rock art of different regions of India, also share about their challenges in the study of Rock Art from the Guest Speakers/Experts.

• Rock Art enthusiasts from any part of the world who is interested to learn about the Uniqueness of Indian Rock Art.


